


ALL GROWED UP

We are delighted to be returning to The Lyric for the third in the trilogy of Tony Macaulay's much loved series; following the successes of Paperboy and Breadboy, we are now journeying with Tony as he leaves Belfast, enters the wild world of University and begins to actually grow up!

Our Young Company Panel choose the shows we are going to develop and put on and they proposed that we approach this adaptation with a uniquely BYMT angle. This inspired the team for All Growed Up to work with Tony on staying true to the spirit of the memoire, whilst creating new scenes, influenced by real life events, and finding the most collaborative and theatrical way of telling the story for a Company of 37 young performers. Writer and Director Dean Johnson has led the team of professional artists to make a thrilling, moving, musical version of Tony's tales, along with the wonderful young people who have joined us in Belfast over the past two weeks.

BYMT couldn't make the work it does without our brilliant Pastoral and Technical staff supporting the Creative team and young people. We rely on our venue partners to host our shows and enjoy returning to the Lyric, to reconnect with the loyal audiences and make friends with the new. "Some day you will be old enough to start reading fairy tales again." - C.S Lewis

It is perhaps the most universal of all human anxieties. We often spend our teenage years hoping for that single moment where we pass our "Growing Up" exam and receive a certificate in "adulting". We come to understand, of course, that the learning and growing never stop. Not really.

When I first approached the inimitable Tony Macaulay 10 years ago to ask him very nicely if he would consider allowing his first memoir, "Paperboy" to be adapted into a musical, I was 21, the same age as Tony in All Growed Up, his third memoir. If you had told me then that ten years later we would be here presenting the third instalment of the "Growing Up" trilogy at The Lyric Theatre having already presented sold out runs of the first two, I'd have said you were a wee dreamer, so you were!

CREATIVES

DEAN JOHNSON - WRITER & DIRECTOR

Dean is a Northern Irish director who fell in love with stories, music and empathy while growing up in Belfast in the 90s and now lives in London working as a freelance Theatre Director, Writer and Filmmaker. Directing credits include: Once (London Palladium/ International Tour), Bat Boy (London Palladium), Bare (London Palladium), Godspell (Cadogan Hall), LIFT (Southwark Playhouse), No Limits (Turbine Theatre), Dogfight (Southwark Playhouse), No Place Like Home (Lyric Theatre), Spring Awakening (Stockwell Playhouse), Paperboy (Lyric Theatre Belfast), Breadboy (Lyric Theatre Belfast), Patterns (Landor Theatre) and Jason Robert Brown's 13 (Cadogan Hall). Digital, TV and Film Directing Credits include: BKLYN and First Date for BroadwayHD and a number of music videos for pop artists. Projects in development include Starry (World Premiere Production). Dean is delighted to be returning to the Lyric Theatre to work on the third musical of the Tony Macaulay series and to work with BYMT again, who he performed shows with as a youngster from Lisburn.

SHAUNA CARRICK - COMPOSER

Shauna's credits as a theatre maker include Shauna Carrick Wants A Dog (Writer/Composer, Dublin Fringe 2023), Tír na nÓg (Writer/Composer, dlr Mill Theatre 2022), Tiny (Lyricist, Summer 2023), Chromatics (Writer/Composer 2018). Shauna has recently participated in a masterclass with writer Claude-Michel Schönberg (Les Mis, Miss Saigon, The Pirate Queen), was awarded a Pavilion Studio Residency (October 2022) and selected as a Mercury Writer's Barn participant by Mercury Musical Developments (April 2023), and is a member of the esteemed Book, Music & Lyrics Advanced Workshop (2019 - present).

ADAM DARCY - MUSICAL DIRECTOR

Adam is a Belfast-based Musical Director, Vocal Coach and Pianist. Adam has conducted and played for numerous musical theatre productions and concerts over the last 14 years, including a number of premieres: The Hunchback of Notre Dame (NI Premiere, Grand Opera House, Belfast), Godspell Broadway Revival (Irish Premiere, Belfast Waterfront) and the NI premieres of Pippin, Into the Woods and Spring Awakening. Adam works extensively with theatre groups, musical societies, ensembles and schools, whilst also teaching a number of private students. Adam has also worked on a number of projects for Peter Corry Productions, a recent highlight being as Musical Director and Arranger on a new series of concerts, Northern Lights, that toured Northern Ireland. Adam continues to study Estill Voice Training under renowned vocal coach, Anne-Marie Speed at The Voice Explained.

GYASI SHEPPY - CHOREOGRAPHER

Gyasi Sheppy hails from Lisburn in Northern Ireland and he studied Performing Arts at SERC Bangor Campus (of which he is now an Ambassador) and came up through various Amateur Dramatics groups when he was younger. Gyasi has been dancing and performing since he was in primary school and knew from a young age he would make a career out of performing. In 2008 Gyasi started a cross-community dance group in his hometown that shot to fame after appearing on BBC Children In Need in 2009 and 2010. From there he launched affordable cross-community in his hometown for young people. Professionally Gyasi worked as a dancer and choreographer for many youth groups across Northern Ireland including Lisburn YMCA, Island Youth Theatre and he was creative director of National Stage School. More recently Gyasi has launched a career

in television in London and Manchester as one of CBeebies regular presenters and has since worked with BBC Children In Need, BBC radio Ulster, BBC Studios and more. He also regularly treads the boards in annual pantomimes across the country and can be seen this year in De Montfort Hall in Leicester playing The Prince in Snow White. Gyasi has also recently secured a ten-book deal to write and publish ten short children's books through Sweet Cherry Publishing! Gyasi has known All Growed Up's Director Dean from childhood and thanks Dean and everyone at BYMT for this opportunity to come home and get back to his roots as a Choreographer.

JIDA AKIL - SET & COSTUME DESIGNER

Jida Akil is a Syrian/Lebanese set & costume designer. Since training at Central Saint Martins, she has worked with notable companies such as the Young Vic, National Theatre, Complicité, and Clean Break. Her designs have also gained international acclaim in exhibitions for the Prague Quadrennial and World Stage Design, as well as the JMK Award Shortlist. Jida is passionate about platforming stories of the global majority & marginalised voices. Selected credits include: Painkiller (Theatre Royal Stratford East), Five Shorts (Young Vic), Funeral Flowers (UK Tour), Penguin (UK Tour), Tender (UK Tour), The 4th Country (Park Theatre). How To Break Out of a Detention Centre (Riverside Studios), The Poison Belt (Jermyn Street Theatre), For A Palestinian (Camden People's Theatre & Bristol Old Vic), A Midsummer Nights Dream (Stafford Gatehouse), Earthquakes in London & Pippin (both Mountview), Complicité Do A-Level Drama (Complicité, Schools Tour), Human Nurture (Schools Tour). Vic), My Son's A Queer, But What Can You Do? (Turbine Theatre & West End), The Trials & Passions of Unfamous Women (Clean Break).


JONATHAN M. DALEY - LIGHTING DESIGNER
