### A NOTE FROM JORDAN PAUL CLARKE & ALI JAMES

"How angry are the salmon, exactly?" we thought when we first started writing this show in 2022. At its heart, we had a story about a community forced to work harder than they could, every day, for a chance at freedom; which resonated with us deeply as we dove around our busy, modern lives whilst trying to maintain our balance and write a new musical. But make it too serious and 'eco-warrior' and it wouldn't be fun... too flippant and daft and it wouldn't mean anything to anyone. So... we made Angry Salmon, a new family musical about some fish being awesome.

But we didn't make it alone. In August last year, we had the amazing experience of working with 38 young performers making the show for the first time at the Drum in Plymouth. The cast and band couldn't have been more inspirational, creating the playful, ambitious physical storytelling that brought life and energy to this show in waves (along with laughter and heart at every turn). This year, we're beyond excited to share the show with a new audience, and a new, phenomenally talented young cast. As they've grown in confidence through supportive play and exploration, so too has the voice of the show.

The passion from the young performers at BYMT has shown us it's an important and moving story, and gives them a voice to express the complex emotions that occur growing up in today's frantic, digital world. This work-in-progress show has now had four weeks of development, which means, in a world where musicals can take years to develop, the young performers have made miracles happen with their sense of humour, aspiration, imagination, risk taking, and professionalism. Angry Salmon has a big heart and big dreams. We're excited for the show to develop further and reach wider audiences, and it feels incredibly apropos that a show about a better tomorrow has begun its journey with a theatre company that gives the next generation of musical theatre artists everything they need to grow and flourish.

So for now, the salmon are angry. Very angry. We know we need to make changes to our world, and it feels like any day now, that could happen... but change isn't happening fast enough, and our young people want it more than anything.

Jordan Paul Clarke is an award-winning writer, composer, musical director and improviser. #### JIDA AKIL - SET DESIGNER


