Our Young Company Panel choose the shows we are going to develop and put on and they were specifically excited by The Power of Camelot happening in the south west, the home of the English myths of Arthur and Camelot. We developed the idea for the show in an Autumn Camp in 2023 and would like to thank the young people who took part in that, as their ideas and enthusiasm for the story inspired us to evolve the quest around the 4 nations into a full length production. #### A NOTE FROM CERYS JONES

It's 9pm on Tues 6 Dec 2022. I'm settled on my sofa for the evening. Some relaxation is needed after a month of preparing for BYMT Auditions and the annual Christmas concert. The film of choice: National Treasure. As Nicholas Cage skips and quips over the television screen, I exclaim 'they really should make a National Treasure about the British Isles'. My partner, knowing a seed of an idea is forming, asks 'what would it be about?' For the next hour, I spoke of magic, monsters, heroes and villains, ancient rivalries and new bonds of friendship. Unbeknownst to me, the first draft of The Power of Camelot had just been created, on my sofa, on a random Tuesday.

This idea, that 'the seed of an idea can bloom and flower', encapsulates what The Power of Camelot stands for. Taking our shared history and cultivating it into something new, holding onto our community whilst still being an individual. Celebrating the brilliance of the specific, in our visits to Wales, Ireland, Scotland and England, along with familiar feelings of friendship, betrayal and redemption, all in one epic adventure has been a joy.

The beauty of musical theatre for me has always been collaboration. When I finally clarified my rambling thoughts, I knew BYMT was the right company to collaborate with. I had seen first-hand their commitment to new work, their support for creative teams and the ethos of inclusive practice. This collaboration only grew as we welcomed more artists into the process, bringing with them their own brilliance and ambitions, an elevation that continued with the inclusion of our young cast and band.

The young people at BYMT never cease to amaze me with their authentic ideas and unending dedication. I may be a little biased as their Young Company Manager, but they are truly the future of musical theatre in this country, and this production is (and has always been) for them and those like them.

#### **CERYS JONES - BOOKS & LYRICS**

Cerys is a writer and director originally from North Wales, now based in London. Her work as a writer/director includes: The Work We Do (The White Bear Theatre); the 'Standing Ovation Award' nominated Cynefin (The Bread and Roses Theatre); Who's Next? (The White Bear Theatre) and The Rogue's Gallery (The Chelsea Theatre). As a director, Cerys worked on BYMT's Wiltshire Autumn Camp 2023, Scenesaver's Just Write! winner's showcase, and multiple productions with amateur dramatics societies. In addition to this, Cerys has been BYMT's Casting and Young Company Manager since 2021, has worked freelance with Stuart Burt Casting and serves as a freelance advisor to independent theatre groups.

#### **RUTH CHAN - COMPOSER**

Ruth is a British Chinese composer for theatre, film & television and concert music. Ruth is an artist who loves working on both classical, contemporary and electronic compositions, merging cross-cultural and eclectic styles together.
